This Indenture made the third day of December one thousand four hundred and ninety two, between William Mullens of the County of Charlotte of the one part and Thomas Williams of the same County of the other part -
Witnesseth that the said William Mullens for and in Consideration of the sum of seventy two pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Williams, before the sealing and Delivery hereof, the receipt whereof the said William Mullens doth hereby acknowledge the said William Mullens for himself and his heirs. Lath give, granted bargained, sold, aliened released, Confirmed, and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain, sell, alien release Confirm unto the said Thomas Williams his heirs and assigns forever, one certain Tract piece or parcel of Land, Situate within the said County whereon the said William Mullens Lath for many years resided his bounded as followeth to wit, beginning at a White oak in James Mullens's line, thence with his line North, forty five Degrees East one hundred & forty four poles to Williams & Collins's Corner White oak, thence with Collins's line South, thirty eight Degrees east

Seventy nine poles to said Collins' Corner pointures, thence with Collins line
South forty two Degrees west one hundred & forty one poles to a new made
Corner Red oak in his line thence a new made line North forty two
Degrees west to the first Station, Containing Seventy nine acres be the same
more or less, together with all appurtenances and emoluments thereto belonging
or therefrom arising, To have and to hold the said Seventy nine acres
of Land with the premises to the said Thomas Williams, to the only use
benefit and emolument of the said Thomas and his heirs forever, and the said
William Mullins for himself and his heirs doth Covenant with the said
Thomas Williams that he the said William Mullins, the aforesaid
Seventy nine acres of Land with the premises, to the said Thomas Williams
and his heirs, and against the Claim right, Title or Demand of him
the said Mullins and his heirs, and against the Claim right, Title or
demand of all and every other person or persons shall & will from
time to time warrant and by these presents forever Defend. In
